

INTERNATIONAL SKATING UNION (I.S.U.)

Communication No. 751

I. Unification of «Deutscher Eissport-Verband», F.R.G., and «Deutscher Eislauf-Verband der D.D.R.», G.D.R.

Upon request from the two German Members the I.S.U. Council decided at its Meeting in London on October 5, 1990, that from today there is only one German Member in the International Skating Union, the Federal Republic of Germany «Deutscher Eissport-Verband».

1. Entries I.S.U. Championships 1991

For the coming season 1990/91 the Council accepted, that for the I.S.U. Championships the F.R.G. has the right to enter a minimum of two skaters at each I.S.U. Championship. As an exception the I.S.U. Council gave F.R.G. the right to enter the following skaters:

2. Figure Skating Technical Committee

Mrs. Walburga Grimm, Damschkestrasse 9, D-O-5085 Erfurt, F.R.G., will remain in the Technical Committee but listed under F.R.G.

3. International Figure Skating Competitions

The entries already made by G.D.R. to International Competitions must be accepted by all organizers of International Competitions. The skaters so entered by the G.D.R. must compete under the name of F.R.G. Only one judge per panel from Germany can represent F.R.G.

4. Entries Speed Skating World Cup 1990/91

F.R.G. has the right to enter 5 skaters, Ladies and Men, for 500, 1000 and 1500 meters and 4 skaters for 3000 and 5000 meters.

5. Referees, Judges and Starters

For 1990/91 Communication No. 745 is valid. The officials mentioned under G.D.R. are valid for F.R.G. as well as their own officials.

For 1991/92 F.R.G. can have exceptionally the following maximum numbers:

Referee I.S.U. Championships 10
Judges I.S.U. Championships 14
Referee International Competitions 10
Judges International Competitions 25

For the season 1992/93 F.R.G. must reduce the maximum numbers to the maximums mentioned in the I.S.U. Regulations.
