




It is with honor and great pleasure that we invite you to the ISU European Figure Skating Champion-ships® 2021 in Zagreb, Croatia's capital, which will take place from January 25 – 31, 2021.

This ISU European Figure Skating Championships® 2021 will be an opportunity to show once again the beauty of this sport which brings skaters together from all over Europe, and connects countries both off and on the ice. It will also be an opportunity for the people of Zagreb to show what good hosts they can be.





The fact that the Zagreb archdiocese was founded in 1094 and that the city was proclaimed a free royal city in 1242, attests to its long history.

Zagreb was founded in a place where the last hills of the Alps merge towards the edge of the Panonian valley, making it an ideal spot for building a city within the Medvednica mountain hills (the highest point is Sljeme at 1035 meters, a favourite picnic spot for Zagrebians) and along the Sava River valley.

Zagreb is the administrative, economic, diplomatic and cultural capital of the country, with a population of almost one million. It is also a university center with forty higher education schools and over 40,000 students, it is a city that is proud of its long history of education: the first secular city school was built in the middle of the 14th century, the first secondary school was founded at the beginning of the 16th century and in the second half of the 16th century, Zagreb had its first university.

Arena Zagreb

Zagreb is a city of science and culture.

Many excellent scientists and artists, who have enriched Croatian and world heritage, work here. The city has approximately fifty museums and galleries, as well as private art collections and about twenty theatres and musical venues. In 1895, the city's oldest theatre, the Croatian National Theatre, with its neo-baroque architecture was opened by the Austro-Hungarian emperor Franz Joseph I.

SCIENCE & CULTURE:

Many open air events and exhibitions are organized from spring to autumn. They create a very special atmosphere in the city and are a true tourist attraction.

The most important cultural institutions and hotels (many of which are members of international hotel chains) are situated in the heart of the city, only walking distance depending on weather to Europe's biggest outdoor café, city center.



Despite being a Central European city in geography, culture and baroque architecture, in many ways, Zagreb has a Mediterranean way of life. Thanks to its many influences, the city has a special charm and hospitable feel generated by its open-hearted people.



A walk through Zagreb is an interesting and pleasant journey that encapsulates both history and modern day life. Ilica, the longest street in Zagreb, divides the city into the old romantic Upper Town and the young, busy and business orientated Lower Town. The oldest areas, Gradec and Kaptol, from which Zagreb arose, are considered to be one of the most preserved and beautiful European city centers built in the Art Nouveau style.



Other main attractions include one of Europe's most lively outdoor markets, such as Dolac, and visiting it always proves to be a memorable experience to all visitors to Zagreb.

You will always remember those almost forgotten scents and tastes of childhood.

The Upper and Lower Towns are connected through the Kamenita vrata (Stone gate), yet another recognizable Zagreb tourist attraction that is linked to many legends and beliefs, as well as to faith and peace.




For some, the most recognizable place in Zagreb is its neo-gothic Cathedral situated at Kaptol. Although it took many centuries to build, the Cathedral that stands today was completed at the end of the 19th century.

The Cathedral's treasury has kept priceless treasures and objects that date back from the 11 th to 19th century. The people of Zagreb are especially proud that during his first visit to the city, Pope John Paul II held a special mass inside the Zagreb Cathedral, commemorating 900 years since the founding of the Zagreb archdiocese.

Unfortunately, at approximately 6:24 AM CET on the morning of 22 March 2020, an earthquake of magnitude 5.5 M, hit Zagreb, Croatia, with an epicenter 7 kilometers (4.3 mi) north of the city center. The maximum felt intensity was VII (Very strong) on the Modified Mercalli intensity scale.

The earthquake was followed by numerous aftershocks, the strongest of which with a magnitude of 5.0.[7] It was the strongest earthquake in Zagreb since the 1880 earthquake and caused substantial damage in the historical city center. Over 1,900 buildings are reported to have become uninhabitable by the earthquake damage, so was the Cathedral.

The tip of its southern spire broke off and crashed onto the roof of the adjacent Archbishop's Palace. On 17 April 2020, the northern spire of Zagreb Cathedral was removed due to leaning during the earthquake.





VISA REQUIREMENTS

Since July 1st 2013 Croatia is a member-state of the European Union.

The Croatian Embassy in your country will provide you with all detailed information about visas.

TRANSPORTATION

Arrival

All ISU Event Officials, Competitors, Team Leaders, Team Officials, Judges, Coaches, Medical staff, Member Press officers and all other members of the Team Delegations taking part in the Champion-ships are requested to announce as soon as possible but not later than January 4, 2021, to the Organizing Committee, the names of the airlines, flight numbers, dates and times of arrival at Zagreb International Airport Franjo Tudjman. If arriving by train, the dates and time of arrival at the Main Railway Station - Glavni kolodvor should also be provided. These locations are considered as the official arrival/departure points for the ISU European Figure Skating Championships® 2021, from where a shuttle bus transfer will be organized. ISU Event Officials and all Team Delegations will be met and transported to the official hotels. The detailed travel information needs to be submitted via the ISU Online Registration System (ORS).

Departure

Transportation at the conclusion of the event for Team Members entitled to complimentary departure transportation to the airport will be managed by scheduled departure shuttle buses and times. Each entitled Team Member's scheduled departure time from the official hotel will be available no later than 1 day prior to departure on the transportation desk at the hotel. No changes in departure times will be allowed unless approved by the Organizing Committee.

Transportation during the event

There will be shuttle bus lines (every 30 min) to connect the Official Hotels with the Main and Practice Rink.

Details will be provided in the accreditation packages upon arrival.

Accreditation room will be located at the Panorama Zagreb Hotel from Saturday January 23, 2021 afternoon till Wednesday January 27, 2021. From Thursday January 28, 2021 till the end of the competition (Sunday January 31, 2021) accreditations will be issued in the OC office at the Panorama Zagreb Hotel or the Accreditation center at the Arena Zagreb.

Accreditation will be located at the Hotel Westin from Sunday, January 24, 2021 till the end of the competition Sunday, January 31, 2021.

All Competitors and Judges will be required to present their passport (and Clearance Certificate if the passport is not of the same country as the Member entering the Skater and/or the Skater having previously represented another Member) prior to receiving accreditation. Accreditation will not be issued without presentation of a valid passport.

Accreditation for the Media will be located at the Arena Zagreb
- Accreditation center from Saturday January 23, 2021 till Sunday, January 31, 2021.

THE ARENAS



The main venue for the ISU European Figure Skating Championships® 2021 is Arena Zagreb. It has a seating capacity of about 15000 seats.

The ice surface is 60 x 30 m.

Arena Zagreb is the largest sports hall in Croatia. It was built in 2008, for the purpose of hosting the 21st Handball World Championship. It is located in the south-western part of Zagreb, Croatia. Thanks to its iconic design and due to its beauty, functionality and importance, Arena Zagreb has become a new architectural symbol of the City of Zagreb.

The unique shape of this building is strongly inspired by its significance in the city context, and also by its mega-structural characteristics that predefined main bearing elements. Shaped as an oval ribbed white bowl, Arena Zagreb has 86 large pre-stressed, pre-fabricated concrete curved columns which form the main façade, mutually connected by illuminate semi-translucent polycar-bonate envelope from which various light effects are achieved. The additional benefit of such system is saving in the volume of air that should be conditioned within the court bowl.

Due to its capacity, multi-functionality, and technical equipment, Arena Zagreb has become an invaluable asset not only to Zagreb and its surrounding regions, but to all of Croatia. Finally Zagreb has a facility worthy for concerts of the world's top musicians and great sporting events. Before this, such events were almost impossible to organize, due to the lack of adequate facilities. The pace of which events fill Arena Zagreb's calendar schedule gives testament to the importance of the Arena to Zagreb and the entire nation. Since its opening in 2009, Arena Zagreb's events calendar has been quickly filled with scheduled concerts of world-renowned musicians.

Klizaliste Velesajam will serve as the practice rink for the Event. Ice surface is 60 x 30 m

Located on Zagreb Fair complex, it was firstly used as Ice arena in 1979. and renewed in 1999. Before it was used as fair pavilion of Zagreb Fair.

15 minutes shuttle-bus ride to the Practice Arena (Zagreb Fair Arena).



USEFUL INFORMATION

LANGUAGE

The official language is Croatian. Many people, especially young, speak English. German is also widely spoken.

WEATHER

Inland Croatia has a continental climate, warm in summer, cold in winter. In Zagreb temperature can easily reach 34°C (90°F) in high summer (June-August) and drop to -14°C (6°F) in winter.

Temperatures start to rise from early March.

January can be cold with average temperatures around 0 °C, there is a slight possibility of snow.

TIME DIFFERENCES

Croatia is a part of the Central European Time Zone

(GMT +1): when it is noon in Zagreb it is 12:00 in Berlin, 11:00 in London, 06:00 in New York, 14:00 in Moscow and 21:00 in Sydney.

ELECTRICITY

The voltage in Croatia is 220 V, 50 Hz, which is the same as the rest of Europe.

CURRENCY & EXCHANGE

The basic Croatian currency unit is KUNA.

Foreign Currency can be exchanged for local money in banks, official exchange offices, post offices, hotels etc.

Many bank branches and exchange offices are normally open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. non-stop (Monday-Friday), and from 8 a.m. to 12 noon (Saturdays).

Most of the banks have cash machines (ATMs), which operate 24 hours a day.

All major credit cards like: American Express, Diners Club, Eurocard/Master Card, Visa, JCB and Eurocheques are advertised at points of sale, are normally accepted throughout Croatia.

TIPPING

It is customary to leave 10% tip in a bar or restaurant

For special services rendered by hotel personnel usually expect tips between 10-50 KUNA.

TAX-FREE SHOPING

Tourist whose purchases exceed 500 KUNA may claim a PDV (VAT) return for all goods except petroleum products when leaving the country with TAX CHEQUE receipts verified by the Croatian Customs Office. Time limit for tax refunds is one year.

LIQUOR LAWS

The minimum legal drinking age in Croatia is 18 years.

TRANSPORTATION

Franjo Tuđman Airport, also known as Zagreb Airport (IATA: ZAG, ICAO: LDZA), is the largest and busiest international airport in Croatia. In 2016 it handled around 2,8 million passengers and some 10,000 tons of cargo.

Named after Franjo Tuđman (1922-1999), the first President of Croatia, the airport is located some 10 km (6.2 mi) south-east of Zagreb Central Station at Velika Gorica. It is the hub for the Croatian flag carrier Croatia Airlines as well as Trade Air.

Zagreb Franjo Tuđman Airport is about 30 minutes away from the city center by car and can be reached by bus or taxi.

Local transport includes trams and busses and the tickets are the same. Tickets can be bought at news stands and they cost 12,00 Kuna. Daily ticket costs 40,00 Kuna. One ticket is valid for 90 minutes and you can change the means and directions of transport.

There are plenty of taxi cabs in the city and they can be ordered by phones Radio Taxi Zagreb (1717), Taxi Cammeo (1212), EKO Taxi (1414), Uber (app), BOLT (app - ex Taxify).

TRG BANA JELACICA

This high achieving army general abolished serfdom and conducted a number of successful military campaigns in the 1848 Revolutions. Although the square's official title is the Trg Bana Jelacica, locals generally just refer to it as Jelacic Square.

You will find it in Zagreb's Upper
Town, not far from Dolac market.
A large number of streets, like
Radiceva, Illica, Gajeva, Splavnica,
Bakaceva, Harmica and Jurisiceva,
all meet at this pedestrianised area
where no cars can enter, so those on
foot and bicycles have greater
freedom to explore. Watch out for
the trams, however!

CHAMPIONSHIPS®



It is said that this was the only structure left standing after the destruction of 1731, as it was decorated with a picture of Jesus and Mary. In order to preserve this picture which had brought about such a miracle, a church was built around it and it now can be viewed inside a case. Worshippers regularly visit to pray here.
