ANNOUNCEMENT

EduSport Sport Club Association and **Romanian Skating Federation** invites you to the 3rd edition of "BELLU MEMORIAL" - Interclub Figure Skating Competition for Novice Advanced, Novice Intermediate, Novice Basic, Cubs, Chicks, Adults and Recreational categories.

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The 3rd **edition of BELLU MEMORIAL** will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2022, the ISU Special Regulations and Technical Rules for Figure Skating as well as pertinent ISU Communications.

Participation in the **3**rd **edition of BELLU MEMORIAL** is open to all competitors who belong to an ISU Member and qualify with regard to eligibility, according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 b) and c) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2562 or any update of it.

Citizenship/Residence requirements and Clearance Procedure:

In accordance with Rule 109 of ISU Regulations and ISU Communication 2562 or any update of it, all skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the passports of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

EUROPEAN CRITERIUM TROPHY: BELLU MEMORIAL is associated with the European Criterium Tournament 2023/24 for Junior, Novice and younger categories. Results of the Teams will count for competition in the International Trophy of Figure Skating European Criterium. Individual points are automatically calculated for all skaters in every category and those are valid in the European Criterium Tournament in the same category. The age requirements and the special regulation for the European Criterium Trophy are published on the website of the EC: www.europeancriterium.eu

Cancellation

Cancellation of the competitor entry, if any, has to be done till February 6th 2024 For any latter cancellation the Federation/Club will be asked to pay the entry fee.

2. TECHNICAL DATA

Place of the event

- Allianz Tiriac Arena Drumul Garii Odai, Bucharest Otopeni 075100 (near Henri Coanda International Airport).
- The rink is indoor, heated. The size of the rink is 60 m x 30 m.
- Parking is available at the ice rink surcharge.

3. ENTRIES

Entries of Competitors

- Competitors from Novice Advanced, Novice Intermediate, Novice Basic, Cubs, Chicks, Adults and Recreational categories must be entered through their clubs, which are members of National Figure Skating Federations, associated with the ISU
- The entries for the Novice Advanced, Novice Intermediate, Novice Basic, Cubs, Chicks categories must be done via web portal - ww.europeancriterium.eu. Before entry procedure a representative of each federation/club needs to apply for a new account on www.europeancriterium.eu. Organizers of the European Criterium website are committed to the proper protection of personal data in accordance with the European Union GDPR Regulation. Therefore, in the context of Privacy Policy, the appropriate consent is required in the applications.
- The entries for the Adults and Recreational categories must be done only using this form (click here).

Entries must reach the Event Organizer not later than January 31, 2024. We don't accept any entry received starting with February 01, 2024.

- Program Content Sheet and additional forms can be downloaded from the official website of the competition: www.europeancriterium.eu.
- The "Program Content Sheet" for all categories must be returned to the Organizing Committee not later than February 6th 2024. It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet will be filled precisely by each Skater in English using terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

Technical Panel

Entries of Judges and Each participating ISU Member may nominate Judges, TC, TS and D/R Operator for the event. However, the OC reserves the right to limit the number of judges in accordance with the number of the Skaters' Entries. The Organizing Committee will only cover the board and lodging for judges accepted in the panel in the Hotel Vienna House**** from the dinner before the day of their activity until the end of their activity, or on the days when the Judge is on duty. Confirmation for Judges will be sent to each Member immediately after the closing of entries. The members concerned will be notified of the result of the draw.

4. MEALS, LODGING and TRAVEL EXPENSES

5. MUSIC

- o It is mandatory to upload files with music the competitors need for their performances. The entry process is the following:
 - Competitors are entered to the European Criterium platform; after the confirmation of the entry, there is an option to attach the appropriate music file to the competitor's application.
 - The competitor's application is "pending" until the music files are uploaded.
 - When the music files are attached to the application the status of competitor's entry changes to active status and the competitor is included in the official competitors list of selected competition.
- o Mandatory music format is .mp3 file format.
- o Files must be labelled with the name of the name of the category, segment, name(s) of the competitor and ISU Member abbreviation.
- o Examples:

 - JuniorWoman FS IONESCU-Ana ROU
- o Each Competitor must have a back-up drive (USB Stick) for each program in the format of MP3 file.

- The opening draw for the order of skating for Novice Advanced, Novice Intermediate, Novice Basic, Cubs, Chicks, Adults and Recreational Categories will be held electronically on February 19th, 2024, and will be available on the competition website.
- Starting order for the Free Skating of Advanced Novice category will be in reverse order of the results in the Short Program.

Technical Requirements

A well balanced Free Skating program for Single Skating boys and girls must contain:

• Maximum of four (4) jump elements one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence.

Jump combinations and the jump sequence consist of two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence the second jump must be an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel jump. One full revolution on the ice between the jumps (free foot can touch the ice, but without weight transfer) keeps the element in the frame of the definition of a jump sequence. Jumps executed in a jump sequence receive their full value. No triple and quadruple jumps are allowed. Only one single jump and one double jump (including Double Axel) can be repeated once.

- There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination and one must be a spin with no change of position. The spin combination with a change of foot and a minimum of eight (8) revolutions or without a change of foot with a minimum of six (6) revolutions. The spin in one position with a change of foot minimum of eight (8) revolutions or spin in one position without change of foot minimum of six (6) evolutions. In both spins flying entries are allowed.
- There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

Levels explanations

For Chicks and Cubs Singles, in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

RECREATIONAL ADVANCED CATEGORIES

A competitor in the Recreational Advanced Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

1) Maximum of four (4) jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any listed jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Any single or double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total.

Triple jumps are not permitted.

- 2) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum two (2) revolution per position and minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed.
- 3) There must be a maximum of one (1) Choreo sequence which must be clearly visible. This element has a fixed base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only. The first visible attempt to execute a choreographic sequence will be contributed to the technical score.

Levels explanations:

For the Recreational Advanced category, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted.

Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

RECREATIONAL CATEGORIES

BASIC

A competitor in the Recreational Basic Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- 1) A maximum of four (4) jump elements. Only single jumps are permitted, no Axel type jump, no double or triple jumps can be included. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. Any jump cannot be executed more than twice in total.
- 2) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation) with change of foot (minimum 2 rotation per position, minimum 6 rotation in total) or without change of foot minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Combo spin is allowed. Flying spin is not permitted.
- 3) There must be a maximum of one (1) Choreo sequence which must be clearly visible. This element has a fixed base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only. The first visible attempt to execute a choreographic sequence will be contributed to the technical score.

Levels explanations:

For Recreational basic category, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

<u>ADULTS CATEGORIES - TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS</u>

Bronze

Free skating: 1 min 40 sec, +/- 10 sec A competitor in the Bronze Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- **a.** A maximum of four (4) jump elements, consisting only of single jumps. **Axel type jumps, double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted.** There may be up to two (2) jump combinations in the free program. Each jump combination may consist of two (2) listed jumps. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- **b.** A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation, which must be a spin in one position with or without a change of foot. **Flying spins are not permitted.**
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- Only features up to and including Level 1 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- **c.** A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence utilizing at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.

- A choreographic sequence consists of at least two different movements like spirals, arabesques, spread eagles, Ina Bauer, hydroblading, transitional (unlisted) jumps. Steps and turns may be used to link the two or more different movements together.
- A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.0.
- Each fall shall receive a deduction of 0.5.
- The warm-up duration is five (5) minutes.

Silver

Free skating: 2 min, +/- 10 sec

A competitor in the Silver Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of five (5) jump elements, consisting of any single jumps (including the single Axel).

Double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.

- One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) jumps. The other may have two (2) jumps.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in combination in between two other listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of connecting footwork.
- **b.** A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation.
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) for any spin with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- Only features up to and including Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- **c.** A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence, utilizing at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.
- A choreographic sequence consists of at least two different movements like spirals, arabesques, spread eagles, Ina Bauer, hydroblading, transitional (unlisted) jumps. Steps and turns may be used to link the two or more different movements together.
- The pattern is not restricted but the sequence must be clearly visible.
- A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.0.
- Each fall shall receive a deduction of 0.5.
- The warm-up duration is five (5) minutes.

Gold

Free skating: 2 min 50 sec, +/- 10 sec A competitor in the Gold Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

a. A maximum of five (5) jump elements, consisting of single jumps (including the single Axel) or double jumps. **Double flip, double Lutz, double Axel and triple jumps are not permitted.**

There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or two jump combinations and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.

- One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) jumps. The others may have two (2) jumps each.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in combination in between two other listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of connecting footwork.
- b. A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance.
- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- **c.** A maximum of one (1) step sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.
- The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 2.67.
- Only features up to and including Level 3 will be counted for the technical elements. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- Each fall shall receive a deduction of 1.0.
- The warm-up duration is six (6) minutes.

Masters Free skating: 3 min, +/- 10

sec

A competitor in the Masters Free Skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

- a. A maximum of six (6) jump elements, one of which must be an Axel type jump. Single and double jumps are permitted. There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or two jump combinations and one (1) jump sequence in the free program.
- One (1) jump combination or one (1) jump sequence may consist of up to three (3) jumps.

The others may have two (2) jumps each.

- A jump sequence consists of two (2) or three (3) jumps of any number of revolutions, in which the second and/or the third jump is an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first/second jump into the take off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in combination in between two other listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of connecting footwork.
- b. A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance.

• The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: five (5) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot. • A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no level and no value, however a spin with less than three rotations in total is considered as a skating movement and not a spin. • Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions. • All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. Participation in the Free Skating at the Adult Figure Skating Categories is open only to competitors who have reached at least the age of twenty-eight (28) before 1st July 2023.

- A skater competing after 1st July 2023 in an ISU Championship, International Competition or National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult International Competition or Adult National Championships) or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult National Championship) MAY NOT participate in this competition.
- A skater competing prior to 1st July 2023 in an ISU Championship or National Championship of a Member Federation or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National championship of a Member Federation MAY participate in this competition.
- A skater meeting the age requirements of this competition, who competes in adult-only events (Single Free Skating) at a National Championships or competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championships of a Member Federation MAY compete in this competition.
- All other members of an ISU Member Federation who meet the age requirements may participate.
