A. WELCOME TO OSTRAVA AND THE CZECH REPUBLIC

The Czech Figure Skating Association together with the City of Ostrava welcome skaters, officials, judges and guests from all International Skating Union Members to the ISU European Figure Skating Championships[®] 2017 in Ostrava, held from January 25th to January 29th.

With over 300,000 people, Ostrava is the third largest city in the Czech Republic. The first written mention of Ostrava dates back to 1267. The city was located on the "Amber Road" – a trade route used by medieval merchants to transport goods between the Baltic Sea and the Mediterranean. A turning-point in the city's history came in the second half of the 18th century, when rich coal deposits were discovered. This brought a rapid boom in iron and steel production. Coal mining in Ostrava finished in 1994, but the city's proud industrial heritage has helped it to maintain a unique and distinctive character, with many memorable attractions for visitors.

Ostrava is a modern, dynamic cultural center. It is renowned for its vibrant theatrical scene, with four permanent theatres including the acclaimed National Moravian-Silesian Theatre. Ostrava has a rich musical tradition, too, and is the home of the internationally renowned Janacek Philharmonic Orchestra.

The city hosts numerous cultural and sporting events throughout the year, including the multi-genre music festival Colours of Ostrava which attracts tens of thousands of visitors from all over Europe to see some of the world's top musical talents. Other popular events include two classical music festivals – Janacek May and the St. Wenceslas Festival – plus the summer Shakespeare Festival, the prestigious Golden Spike athletics meeting (in which the world's fastest man Usain Bolt participates regularly), and NATO Days – one of Europe's premier military shows, held at the Mosnov airport. In 2014, Ostrava could boast with a title of European City of Sport. In 2004 and 2015, the city co-hosted (together with Prague) the IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship.

C. WHILE IN OSTRAVA - PLACES TO VISIT, THINGS TO DO

There are number of places to visit in Ostrava and its surroundings...

New City Hall

Ostrava's New City Hall has the tallest tower of any city hall in the Czech Republic, giving visitors a panoramic bird's-eye view of the city from the viewing platform 73 meters above the ground.



Ostrava Science and Technology Center

Ostrava's Science and Technology Center is a fun and interactive attraction where visitors can learn all about the fascinating world of technical progress. Highlights include simulators where visitors can drive a train, fly a plane, or experience being a steelworker, an astronaut, or even Captain Nemo – helping people of all ages understand the complex principles of science in an entertaining and accessible way. The Science and Technology Center is divided into two parts: the Small World of Technology and the Large World of Technology (14 000 m²), where visitors can explore four different "worlds" in one building.



Bolt Tower

This historic blast furnace at the Lower Vitkovice complex is open to visitors, who can ride the glass elevator to the top and enjoy refreshments at a café offering panoramic views of the entire city and the surrounding countryside. Visitors can also see down into the very heart of the former furnace.



Stodolni Street

Ostrava's legendary entertainment district boasts over 60 bars, clubs, restaurants and cafés offering a huge range of food and drink plus music of all genres. Like New York, Stodolni Street never sleeps!



Landek Park Mining Museum

At this fascinating museum you can take a tour of the former Anselm coal mine with a guide who used to be a miner there. The tour includes a descent into a simulated mine tunnel – giving a real sense of the noise and atmosphere of a working colliery. There is also a restaurant where you can sample authentic miners' specialties. A perfect way to immerse yourself in the rich culture of this proud profession.



Ema slag-heap

On the right bank of the Ostravice River, this slag-heap (an artificial hill created by piling up slag – the waste material from coal mines) reaches a height of 315 meters above sea level. It enjoys its own unique subtropical climate because the slag is still burning deep beneath the surface – you'll see the white smoke coming out of the cracks in the ground. Snow never settles here, and flowers grow all year round. Take the yellow-marked hiking path to the top of Ostrava's very own volcano, where you can enjoy some wonderful panoramic views of the city.



Miniuni World of Miniatures

The Miniuni World of Miniatures is a unique attraction at the Black Meadow (Cerna Louka) exhibition center, including miniature versions of some of the world's most famous buildings. Who could resist travelling around the whole world in just one afternoon? Pose for photos next to Ostrava's very own Pyramids, Eiffel Tower, or Big Ben.



Silesian Ostrava Castle

The Silesian Ostrava Castle once stood on higher ground than it does now, but during its long history it has sunk by 16 meters as mine tunnels have collapsed underneath it. It is situated not far from Ostrava's central Masaryk Square, at the point where the Lucina and Ostravice rivers meet. The castle is a popular venue for events throughout the year – including the summer Shakespeare festival and a range of fun events for children and families.




The spa town of Klimkovice

F. TRAVEL INFORMATION

VISA

The Czech Republic is part of the <u>Schengen Area</u>, which agreed on the abolition of border controls between themselves and on common visa regulations.

By applying for Czech Visa, a foreigner applies for so-called Schengen Visa which allows him/her to travel inside of the Schengen Area without any restrictions. TRANSPORTATION TO OSTRAVA

The capital of Moravian-Silesian Region is not difficult to reach. While making your travel arrangements, you can find the following recommendations useful.

By plane

Ostrava – Mosnov, Leos Janacek International Airport (OSR)

The flight duration from the Vaclav Havel Airport in Prague Ruzyne to Ostrava-Mosnov Airport is approximately 45 – 60 min (the distance covered is app. 400 km).

Katowice (Poland) – Pyrzowice Airport (KTW)

Katowice (Pyrzowice) Airport (KTW) is situated about 125 km from Ostrava with an approximately travel time of 1 hour (by bus) to Ostrava. The whole way is newly-made modern highway.

Krakow (Poland) – Balice Airport (KRK)

Krakow Airport is situated about 160 km from Ostrava with an approximately travel time of 1,5 hour (by bus) to Ostrava. The whole way is newly-made modern highway.

Prague-Ruzyne, Vaclav Havel International Airport (followed by train)

From Prague, the Vaclav Havel Airport, you can take a direct Airport Express bus (AE) to the Prague Main Railway Station "Praha - Hlavni nadrazi" (the journey takes about 30 to 50 min., bus departs every 20 to 30 min.).

You can also take Bus No 119 (departing every 5 to 10 minutes) to "Nadrazi Veleslavin" station and then underground - A Line - to the Museum station, there change to the C Line to the "Hlavni nadrazi" station (takes about 50 min.).

Or you can take Bus No 100 to Zlicin station (departing every quarter hour at working time or every half an hour on the evenings and weekends), then underground - B Line - to the Florenc station, there change to the C Line to the "Hlavni nadrazi" station (takes about 55 min.). Then take a train from Prague to Ostrava-Svinov.

By train

From Prague Main Railway Station (Praha - Hlavni nadrazi)

The 400 km distance is covered in 3 to 4 hours.

There are more than 30 direct trains a day from Prague to Ostrava.

Besides many trains to other destinations in Silesia, Poland and Slovakia via Ostrava, there are currently 3 companies providing regular service between Prague and Ostrava (5 to 10 times per day per company) with limited amount of stops on the journey and using very comfortable and modern trains.

Train tickets are inexpensive (varied between CZK 130 and 700 – approx. EUR 5-25).

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Official transportation

The official arrival/departure points for the ISU European Figure Skating Championships® 2017, from where and to which shuttle transfer will be organized to/from the official hotels, are:

Leos Janacek Airport Ostrava (OSR)
Katowice Airport (KTW)
John Paul II International Airport Krakow-Balice (KRK)
Ostrava-Svinov Train Station.

Official transportation will be organized based on the arrival and departure information provided by teams to Organizing Committee in a timely manner. Organizing Committee must be informed about arrivals/departures if transportation is expected/required.

Coaches, Team Medical Staff and Chaperones will be provided with official transportation only

Event Shuttle

There will be two official shuttle bus lines provided: one connecting the Imperial Hotel and the Rink, the second one connecting the Park Inn Hotel and the Rink. The shuttle service will be provided every 30 minutes. Bus routes will be color coded. Bus stops will be clearly indicated.

Due to a very short distance between the Clarion Congress Hotel and the OSTRAVAR ARENA, there will be no shuttle service connecting these two places.

Only people with valid accreditation are eligible to use the provided shuttle bus service. Chaperones who would like to use the official shuttle busses will have to apply for a special bus permit issued by OC at the accreditation center at the Athletic Hall (see Registration & Accreditation below).

Travel within Ostrava

To explore the city, the easiest way is to take a tram. Tickets can be bought at ticket vending machines or kiosks at most tram stops. The same applies for buses, which are just as comfortable.





Registration & Accreditation

All ISU Office Holders, ISU Event Officials, Judges, Competitors, Team Leaders, Team Officials, Team Medical Staff and one Coach (per Competitor) taking part in the Championships are requested to register for the ISU European Figure Skating Championships[®] 2017.

The process will comply with ISU Memorandum guidelines. The colors and icons code will be observed.

The standard form will be in place to request a late accreditation. Persons handling the accreditation system are not entitled to change or add any accreditations that are not approved.

No changes to team accreditation will be accepted after the Team Leaders meeting.

Chaperons will not get an accreditation. For competitions, chaperones must buy tickets. To attend practices, chaperones can either get practice tickets or they can use their shuttle bus permits (see chapter Event Shuttle above).

All Competitors and Judges will be required to present their passports (and Clearance Certificate if the passport is not of the same country as the Member entering the Skater and/or the Skater having previously represented another Member) prior to receiving accreditation.

Accreditation will not be issued without presentation of a valid passport. Exact operating hours to be confirmed in accordance with the arrival schedule.

Only one Coach per Skater will be accredited. An Assistant Team Leader will be accepted for Teams having six (6) and more Skaters. Only two Officials of each Member, including the Member President, will be accredited. Not more than one (1) Team Doctor and one (1) Team Physiotherapist will be accepted as the Team Medical Staff, for which the organizer requests the right to have a medical certification (document) presented before accreditation. A partner or relative of a Judge will be accepted for restricted accreditation.

Lost accreditation card

Forgotten, lost or stolen accreditation cards must be reported and can only be replaced at Registration for a cash fee of EUR 100. The ISU and OC must approve replacement accreditations.

The accreditation centers will be located as follows:

Clarion Congress Hotel - Competitors and Teams

- Time of operation: from Saturday, January 21st, 2017 closing date / time according to arrival schedule of people accommodated at the Clarion Congress Hotel
- Operating hours: in accordance with the arrival schedule.

Imperial Hotel - ISU Office Holders, ISU Event Officials, ISU Guests, Judges

- Time of operation: from Sunday, January 22nd, 2017 closing date / time according to arrival schedule of people accommodated at the Imperial Hotel
- Operating hours: in accordance with the arrival schedule.

Ice Rink (Athletic Hall) - Media, TV, OC, chaperones, volunteers, late arrivals.

- Time of operation: from Friday, January 20th, 2017 until Sunday, January 29th, 2017
- Operating hours: fixed operating hours (exact times to be decided and announced).

G. ACCOMMODATION

General information

Reservations of teams can be made through the OC only, using the Online Registration System (ORS), preliminary hotel tab.

Based on the preliminary entries, member federations will kindly be asked to make a pre-payment. Member federations are required to balance and settle full payment latest at registration.

Accompanying persons

For Team Members not covered by the OC and sharing room with a Team Member whose accommodation is covered by the OC, the OC will charge 50 % of the room rate.

Judges bringing an accompanying person will be charged the difference between the single and twin bed room.

Chaperones

Chaperones (max. one per skater) will not stay at the same hotel as teams (see the list of official hotels below). There will be no shuttle bus service offered between OSTRAVAR ARENA and the chaperones' hotel. However, chaperones with a valid shuttle bus permit can use shuttle buses to travel between OSTRAVAR ARENA and the Imperial Hotel or Park Inn Hotel (see chapter Event Shuttle above).

Incidentals

For all individuals and rooms, hotel extras, including such services as telephone charges, Pay TV, room service, mini bar, laundry and dry cleaning, are to be settled directly with the hotel upon checkout.

All Pay TV Channels and telephones will be blocked upon check-in, and can only be activated when presenting a personal credit card at the hotel front desk.

Each federation is responsible for incidentals and the Team Leader for each federation is appointed contact person. For any issues in regard to room allocation, changes, damage in room etc. the Team Leader is agreed to be the contact person.

Any room change should be addressed to the OC. No changes are allowed directly with the hotel.

All expenses for accommodation and meals for Referees and Judges will be covered by the Organizing Committee during the period as listed below:

- Referees: from lunch on January 23rd till lunch on Monday, January 30th, 2017;
- Judges Pairs and Ladies: from lunch on January 23rd till lunch on January 30th, 2017;
- Judges Ice Dance: from lunch on January 24th till lunch on January 30th, 2017;
- Judges Men: from lunch on January 25th till lunch on January 30th, 2017.

I. THE VENUE

OSTRAVAR ARENA, the modern, multi-purpose arena was completed and inaugurated in 1986 as the largest and the most modern multifunctional hall of that time in Europe. Since then, it has been one of Ostrava´s landmarks.

During its existence, OSTRAVAR ARENA has become a major sports and cultural center and a popular venue for National, European and World championships, concerts of the biggest pop stars, sports tournaments and other events.

The arena was place of many top figure skating events in the past, for example:

World Junior Figure Skating Championships 2003 ISU Junior Grand Prix Final 2005 ISU Junior Grand Prix (9x)

With its capacity of more than 10,000 seats, OSTRAVAR ARENA is one of the largest multipurpose halls in the Czech Republic and thanks to modern technical facilities (including a hitech jumbotron), a number of different possible internal setups and a wide range of services, it can provide a perfect setting for most events.

A part of the arena is also another multifunctional arena to be used as practice rink literally under one roof.









J. USEFUL INFORMATION

The Climate

During winter, the temperatures are around 0°C, but at night, they can get lower than -10°C. It can also snow, but usually, the snow cover will not last for more than a few days. January is usually very cold with many snowy days.

Currency

Czech crown (CZK) is the official currency in the Czech Republic.

1 USD = CZK 23.90 1 EUR = CZK 27.00 (as of August 2016)

Credit cards

All major credit cards are accepted in the Czech Republic.

Most hotels, shops, restaurants and taxi accept VISA and Master Card. American express may not be accepted in some cases.

The standard VAT rate in the Czech Republic is 21 %. There are also reduced VAT rates of 15 % and 10 %, mainly for some services, medicines and books.

Tipping in restaurants is not mandatory, but 5-10 % tips are recommended if good service is received.

Banks

Monday - Friday: approximately from 9 am till 3-5 pm; Saturday, Sunday: usually closed.

Some banks have their branch offices in shopping malls where they are open Mo-Sun according to the opening hours of the malls.

The electricity
