<p>a) If a loss of control occurs during the ChSI while the skater(s) is on one knee, both knees or any other part(s) of the body and the majority of the body weight is not on a blade (example – skater is on one knee with no blade on the ice), will the Technical Panel consider this a Fall?</p> <p>b) Will the ChSI still be identified and confirmed by the Technical Panel even if a loss of control occurred at any point during the execution of the element?</p>	<p>a) Yes. If the error meets the definition of a Fall (Rule 503): "A Fall is defined as loss of control by a Skater with the result that the majority of his/her own body weight is on the ice supported by any other part of the body other than the blades e.g. hand(s), knee(s), back, buttock(s) or any part of the arm."</p> <p>b) Yes. If the ChSI can still be identified, even with a loss of control at any point within the execution of the element, the Technical Panel will confirm.</p>	<p>The Judges will evaluate the error in accordance with the GOE chart.</p> <p>Any Required Element, including the Choreographic Element(s), is identified and confirmed by the Technical Panel if during ANY part of the execution the basic definition of the element can be identified.</p>
