Denis was what you would call a “skater’s skater” in that he had a quality which was admired by both the spectators he mesmerized as well as his fellow competitors that universally respected him. His competitive accomplishments are too extensive to mention one by one but we would be remiss to not highlight his sensational performance that earned him the 2014 Olympic Bronze medal in Sochi. This achievement marked the first ever Winter Games medal in figure skating for his home country of Kazakhstan.
