Decision of ISU Disciplinary Commission

On November 4, 2013, the ISU filed a complaint against Ms. Oksana Nagalati, a member of the Russian Figure Skating Federation, for an alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation.

Following consideration of the alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation, the ISU Disciplinary Commission has, on December 27, 2013 taken the following decision:

“Decision

- 1. Oksana Nagalati is declared responsible for an Anti-Doping violation, committed on September 14, 2013, at the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating in Kosice, Slovakia.*
- 2. A period of ineligibility of one year, beginning on September 14, 2013 and ending on September 13, 2014, is imposed on Oksana Nagalati.*
- 3. The competitive results of the couple Oksana Nagalati / Maxim Bobrov obtained from September 13, 2013 (Short Program) to September 14, 2013 (Free Skating Program), at the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating in Kosice, Slovakia, are disqualified with all the resulting consequences including forfeiture of any medals, points and prizes.*
- 4. The Figure Skating Federation of Russia has to reimburse the ISU for the costs of these proceedings and the laboratory fees of the Anti-Doping testing.*
- 5. The skater bears her own costs.”*

The decision of the Disciplinary Commission is published in full on the ISU website.

This decision is subject to appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), as per Article 24 Paragraph 12 and Article 25 of the ISU Constitution 2012.
