Decision of ISU Disciplinary Commission

On December 16, 2013, the ISU filed a complaint against Ms. Sandra Ristivojević, a member of the Serbian Skating Association, for an alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation.

Following consideration of the alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation, the ISU Disciplinary Commission has, on February 1st, 2014 taken the following decision:

“Decision

- 1. Sandra Ristivojević is declared responsible for an Anti-Doping violation, committed on September 27, 2013, at the Nebelhorn-Trophy 2013 in Oberstdorf, Germany.*
- 2. A period of ineligibility of one year, beginning on February 1, 2014 and ending on January 31, 2015, is imposed on Sandra Ristivojević.*
- 3. The competitive results of Sandra Ristivojević, obtained from September 26, 2013 (Short Program) to September 27, 2013 (Free Skating Program), at the Nebelhorn-Trophy 2013 in Oberstdorf, Germany, are disqualified with all the resulting consequences including forfeiture of any medals, points and prizes.*
- 4. The Serbian Skating Association has to reimburse the ISU for the costs of these proceedings.*
- 5. The skater bears her own costs.”*

The decision of the Disciplinary Commission is published in full on the ISU website.

This decision is subject to appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), as per Article 24 Paragraph 12 and Article 25 of the ISU Constitution 2012.
