Decision of ISU Disciplinary Commission

On April 10, 2014, the Korean Olympic Committee and the Korea Skating Union filed a complaint asking for an investigation relating to the Ladies Figure Skating event during the 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi.

Following the response of the ISU Disciplinary Commission of April 14, 2014 informing the complainants that a general request for investigation cannot be subject to the jurisdiction of the ISU Disciplinary Commission and further noting that the complaint was not addressed to a respondent and must be directed at an individual or a federation, the Korean Olympic Committee and the Korea Skating Union filed a second complaint on April 30, 2014. The second complaint was directed at Ms. Alla Shekhovtseva, a Figure Skating Judge from Russia who officiated in the panel of the Free Skating Ladies event during the 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi.

Following consideration of the alleged violations of the ISU Rules, the ISU Disciplinary Commission, on May 30, 2014, rendered the following decision:

- 1. The complaint of April 10, 2014 is inadmissible.
- 2. The complaint of April 30, 2014 is dismissed.
- 3. Each party bears its own costs.

The present decision is subject to appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport, Avenue de Beaumont 2, CH-1012 Lausanne, Switzerland, within 21 days upon receipt of the decision, in accordance with Article 24 Paragraph 12 and Article 25 of the ISU Constitution 2012. The decisions of the Disciplinary Commission are published in full on the ISU website.
