Media Accreditations now open: ISU World Cup Short Track Speed Skating Series 2022/23

The [ISU World Cup Short Track Speed Skating Series](#) is comprised of six international events and, during the season 2022/23, the coveted ISU World Cup Short Track Crystal Globe will be up for grabs.

COVID-19 Measures

In an ongoing Covid-19 pandemic context, the health and safety of all participants at ISU Events including the athletes, team members, officials, volunteers, service providers, broadcasters, media, and spectators needs to be given additional attention. The [Guidelines for ISU Events during the COVID-19 Pandemic](#) and the [Sport Specific Annex – Short Track Speed Skating](#) describe the minimum sanitary measures that must be put in place to host an ISU Event during a COVID-19 pandemic situation. If the local health authorities require a stricter policy in order to host the Event, those stricter policies will need to be followed.

General measures – subject to changes (see details in the respective ISU Covid-19 Guidelines):

- Masks are not mandatory but it is highly recommended to wear them inside the official Event locations (Ice Rink, Transportation, Hotel). If the host country/local community/venue has a stricter mask wearing policy, then masks must be worn as per the local authorities' policy.
- Social distance must apply wherever possible.

Media will be informed of any Covid-19 testing policy that could be implemented during these events. Media/Journalists will be responsible to cover the costs for any required tests.

Pre-conditions on attending an ISU Event for all on-site media

In order for any media accreditation application to be considered, the following requirements need to be observed :

1. Apply for media accreditation via the relevant Organizing Committee (OC) below or through the ISU OMAS system.
2. Present the necessary documentation as requested by the ISU or OC, and which may include sanitary certifications/testing results.
3. Respect any sanitary guidelines that may be in place depending on the situation in each country.

The ISU will not be held responsible for any travel restrictions, visa applications or delays, even if an accreditation request has been approved.
